Rules with Jules

Rule 40 Players duties

40.1 The Skip MUST

40.1.7.1 be responsible for the scorecard

- .1.7.2 ensure names of all players are correctly entered on the card
- .1.7.3 record all shots scored as each end is completed
- .1.7.4 compare card with the opposing skip as each end is completed
- .1.7.5 at the end of the game record the time the game finished, sign the card and have the opposing skip sign
- 40.1.10 Skips can, at any time, delegate their own powers and any duties (except those in Law 40.1.7) to any other team member as long as they tell the opposing skip immediately.

Our Greens PASS The Tests!

At the start of last season Bowls Kapiti Coast used top Wellington green keeper Howard Ivory to test the quality of all the greens in the centre. Arne was not impressed with the methods used in the test. Apparently he just sent a few bowls down on each hand on a couple of rinks and that was it. Then we discovered that he had rated our Dales green as unsuitable for centre event play as it played too fast, The cotula was ok.

That basically meant that unless we had two greens up to standard then we could not expect to host significant centre events. The best we got in fact were the finals of Div III Interclub. Not that the club was too worried as the more centre events we host the fewer days it is available for own club players.

But, how things have changed. On 20 October our greens were tested again. This time by respected local green keeper Scott Sinclair-Paton who looks after the greens at Paraparaumu Beach, Paekakariki and Waikanae Beach.

This time Arne was much more impressed. Scott used the standard 1 metre high 45 degree ramp to run the test bowls down and inspected each rink. The results were:

Dales green Speed 17.3 seconds One minor 'straightener'

Up to standard for National play

TigerTurf green Speed 16.7 seconds

Up to standard for International play

A major turnaround then. A pity the centre did not use Scott earlier. The venues this are set early in the season. Our Women's Pennants teams never get to play at home. Men's Div I Pennants get to play at home once, and Div 2 and 3 twice. And Central's green are out of action!

Women's Interclub never play at home. Men's Premier II and Div III get to play at home once. So who have our women upset? Travelling, travelling, travelling!

Club Selection Policy

A few years back our club developed a Club Selection Policy. It listed all the events the club entered teams in, the playing conditions and selection priorities. While a number of events have been deleted in recent years, e.g. Horowhenua Cup, Leila Secker Fours, most are still played. There is a folder in the library shelf which has all the details.

The most important and prestigious events are:

- Interclub, Pennants and Godfrey Bowen Mixed Mixed Masters - the selectors choose the best players available for these events. For Interclub there are strict rules about when players can move down a division which are stated in the playing conditions on the centre website.
- Rotary and Horowhenua Fives are mid-week events and the convenors of those events should pick players who have not been selected for the major events unless there problems with player availability. For those reasons it is not a great idea to pick teams for the whole season. Better to choose month by month.

There are a few other events e.g. Ladies Banner, still running that the criteria for selection are also stated.

Don't think these principles have ever been revisited and with all the centre events that have been deleted it is time that a sub-committee reviewed them.
