Question: When is a bowl too short?

Recently the issue came up as to whether a bowl had been delivered from the mat and ended up way short of the jack was too short. So, is there a minimum distance a bowl has to travel?

Answer: Yes.

The relevant rule is the 'Dead Bowl' rule

17.3.1 reads:

A bowl is dead if:

"after completing its original course, or after being moved as result of play, it comes to rest at a distance of less than 14 metres, as measured in a straight line, from the centre of the mat line to the nearest point of the bowl".

Interclub Round Up 2023-24

Interclub is the premier club competition in our centre because the winning clubs in Premier I go on to national finals. Many thanks to all the players who made themselves available to represent the club and to the club selectors who organized the teams, often having to make late changes as injuries and illness struck.

Women's Premier I and II

Both these teams acquitted themselves very well and can be very pleased with their second placing after the round robin. The two second places meant that Levin were the most successful club overall.

Premier I had 10 wins out of their 18 games with both the singles and fours having four wins and the pairs two. Raumati finished in top position with 13 wins, while Central also had 10 wins to finish third on differential. In the finals our results were not so good and the team finished fourth with only two wins. Raumati were the champions. So do we really need finals playoffs?

Premier II had 7 wins from their 12 games headed only by Waikanae United with 8 wins. The fours team were unbeaten and Elisabeth won three of her four games in the singles to lead the competition. The team held the lead going into the last day and a better result from the pairs would have given the club the title as there was no finals play off with only five teams involved.

Men's Premier I and II

It is fair to say that the results for all three teams have been very disappointing after a very strong showing last season. With one day to play the Premier I team are in last place with only 3 wins from 12 games and the two teams in Premier II are seventh and eighth with 4 and $3\frac{1}{2}$ wins, which puts them way behind the sixth placed team Central who have 8 wins. So the playoffs are off the menu and our men's selectors will be pondering where it all went wrong this season.
