Big Changes at Bowls New Zealand

Bowls New Zealand CEO **Mark Cameron** recently announced a major restructuring of the roles of the support staff who provide services to bowling clubs. The major change is that the four regional CDO positions have been disestablished and the roles of the persons who held those roles redeployed. Under the new system which will take effect from 1 May:

Chris Lander - the 2 IC at Bowls NZ - will be General Manager Clubs and Community. He will be the Primary point of contact between clubs/centres and Bowls NZ on administration and communication matters, commercial schemes, facilities, management of tournaments and new competitions.

Steve Beel will be Club Support Manager, the primary point of contact between clubs/centres and Bowls NZ on administrative matters, club census, the 'ClubCheck' model, clubs Database, Health & Safety matters, liquor licensing matters, club administration resource support and greenkeepers support.

Martin Mackenzie will be Club communications Manager, the Primary point of contact between clubs/centres and Bowls NZ on communication matters, membership Database, including competition management and ranking system, guidance and support to clubs relating to Websites and Social Media, management of Bowls NZ communications and support to Centres, Judicial Matters, Club Constitutions and Legal matters.

Keith Slight will be starting in a new contract role with Bowls NZ specifically tasked with managing our Bowling Club Insurance scheme which 95 clubs have so far joined.

As Mark Cameron wrote "The desire to restructure was an acknowledgement that the limited resources of Bowls New Zealand would be better directed working with clubs on key projects and initiatives that seek to grow and enhance the game."

It will be interesting to see if the new strategy delivers a better service to our clubs and our centre.

What is a successful club?

Creating a Successful and Sustainable Club Network.

Is our club heading in the right direction ? How many of the 10 common characteristics of a successful club listed below do we have in place ?

Auckland Bowls is currently working with 17 Clubs who have a Club Development Agreement in place. A full review of the programme is currently underway and we hope to be able to share the results of this over the next couple of months. Research shows that successful clubs have 10 common characteristics. Have a think about your club and see how you go in each of these areas:

- Sound planning - Gives direction to a successful club's operation. A 12- month Business Plan with a longer term plan in place as well.

- Have an understanding of the club's strengths and weaknesses.

- Designated Marketing Committee and resource in place - This committee will drive the promotional activities and membership and participation recruitment/retention of your club.

- The Club knows its local community and knows where and how to target members and participants.

- Local Community knows the club - People know of and can locate your club with good community awareness

- Effective communication with club members and participants

- Club members and participants recruit by word of mouth.

- Team of active volunteers - A successful club has a large number of volunteers who are happy in their role spreading the volunteer load.

- Something for everyone - Offer Bowls events and social calendars that meet the needs of almost anyone.

- Welcoming attitude - Club members are positive to new members and participants.

The statistics:

Auckland Bowls casual participants increased by 19% from 2017 to 2108; First year players increased 75%; secondary school participation increased 247%; but full playing members decreased by 3.4 % - about the same rate as in the Kapiti Coast centre.
