Top Results from Our Women

The two most recent Kapiti Coast women's open events have produced some top results from our women. In the open fours played in November at our club it was two home teams that made it through to the final - the teams of **Dianne Short** and **Irene Poletti.**

In post section play Irene's team of **Irene** (skip), **Pat Segedin, Ralda Adams** and **Colleen Hall** had beaten another club team of Heather Stempa 20 - 17, then Paraparaumu Beach's team of Eileen Jones 18 - 17 and Waikanae's Heather Lawton 19 - 9 to reach the final.

On the other side of the draw **Dianne**'s team of **Hazel Rose, Mary Judd** and **Carol Turnbull** defeated in turn Paraparaumu's Jean Crafts 17 - 16, Central's Bea Gray 12 - 9 and Paraparaumu's Berenice Crowther.

In the final **Dianne**'s team prevailed by 15 points to 10 but it was a close game than the score indicated. All in all a great result for the women of our club.

The Kapiti Coast Women's Open Pairs produced another great result for our club. The combination of **Heather Stempa** and **Wendy Whitelaw** made it through to the final where they were beaten by the Central pair of Timeri Sanders and Marei Bevan 11 - 25 but they enjoyed a great run through to the final. Playing at Paraparaumu Beach in the post section they defeated G Baxter from Raumati and Heather Lawton from Waikanae before meeting the rep pairing **Audrey** and **Rochelle Stevenson** in the semi final. Encouraged by a small number of their club members they led virtually all the way to come out winners by 18 points to 16 to ensure Audrey did not add to her 50 + centre titles. They could not quite match that effort in the final which was delayed weeks after the earlier rounds but Heather and Wendy greatly appreciated the members from our club who went down to support them.

Our Women's Four were also victorious in the Leila Secker Fours played at Waikanae recently. The team was Dianne Short (s), Alice Spicer, Mary Judd and Wendy Whitelaw. And for good measure the four of Irene Poletti (s), Audrey Sciascia, Heather Stempa and Bella Law.

Opinion - An Unsatisfying Interclub Competition

This season's BKC National Interclub competition has been quite unsatisfactory on a number of levels. As the only event where the winners of the Men's and Women's Premier Interclub competitions go on to represent their clubs in National finals it left a great deal to be desired.

First, there is the thorny issue of Byes. There were byes in both the Women's and Men's Premier I grades. The Tournament Committee found it difficult to get some clubs to enter teams which has led to the problem of byes. But, it is also partly a problem of scheduling and the need to play three games in a day. A number of players in our club have not been happy to travel just to play one morning or afternoon game, or worse still, to have a bye for the second game on a day when three games are scheduled which means sitting around for up to three hours waiting to play the third game.

Second, scheduling three games on a day requires an 8.30 am start. The early start creates problems for players, most of who are well advanced in years, in being up early, travelling up or down a highway that is a construction site for a good deal of its length where only modest speeds are possible, and being at the playing venue by 8 am ready to play. It also means a long playing day for the mainly older members of our club.

The third issue is the timing of the competition. The National finals, for the winning clubs in the Premier I competitions are not to be held until 15-18 April. Yet our Women's Premier I competition was completed on 21 November - and they only got to play three games. So it will be five long months before the winning Paraparaumu Beach team head down to Canterbury for the finals ! Even Men's Premier I ended on 10 January - three months before the finals. There is no need to play three games in one day. Simply adding one more playing day to the programme would solve the problem. So why was it necessary to play the Kapiti Coast Interclub so early ? Why can't some re-scheduling be done to play the competitions in the mid-summer months when the greens are in better condition and the weather more reliable?

Our Executive has set up a sub-committee to suggest changes which will be forwarded to the centre for consideration well before next season's programme is set. Hopefully we can initiate some positive change.
