So How Did Our Club's Teams Perform?

Over the season there were 13 Interclub and Pennants divisions contested by a total of 72 teams from 10 of the centre's 12 clubs - including the composite Otaki & Railway teams. Only Levin RSA and Waitarere Beach did not enter any of the competitions. Those 13 divisions attracted an average of 5.53 entries. The trend is noticeable - the number of entries to these competitions is continuing to fall as club's playing numbers continue to fall. The table below gives some indication of the relative playing strengths of the clubs:

These bare statistics conceal a number of factors. For example, Levin Women's cannot take part in men's competitions, and Paekakariki made no entries into mid-week Pennants as they generally have a younger, working age playing profile.

At present Central and Paraparaumu have the greatest overall playing strength which is reflected in the average competition placing winning 8 of the 13 competitions (Paraparaumu Beach won 6 of the 13 competitions and Central 2) and entering more teams in relation to their membership size than other clubs. The 6 teams representing the Otaki and Otaki Railway clubs did well winning two competitions. Other clubs such as Waikanae (especially) and Waikanae Beach are fielding few teams compared with their overall playing membership.

The pattern is repeated in the players selected for the National Intercentre and Masters teams. Of the 34 players chosen 25 are from either Paraparaumu Beach or Central, with 3 each from Paekakariki and Raumati, 2 from Waikanae and one from Otaki. Similarly, in the Under 8's teams 15 of the 20 players selected for the Hexagonal were from Paraparaumu Beach or Central, with the other 5 from Waikanae and Levin.
