Bowls New Zealand Announcement

Coronavirus / COVID-19

Update as of Friday 20 March, Bowls New Zealand strongly recommends that (until further notice) all bowling clubs throughout the country be closed for all organised bowls events and activities.

This effectively means that all organised bowls events and activities throughout New Zealand are either postponed or cancelled for the rest of the summer 2019 -2020 season.

Coming Events

- Roll ups will resume as soon as we are allowed to restart
- The Match Committee will decide what and when other events may be able to be played.

How Our Club Is Affected

Arohanui Hospice Gala

The club held its **4**th **Arohanui Hospice Charity Gala** on Saturday 7 March. The Hospice set up a clinic in Levin to meet the needs of about one third of its clients who live in the Horowhenua district. The club sees this gala as an opportunity to extend the role that the club plays in the local community through its work with the *Business House Bowls* programme which it has run every summer for the past 28 years.

Tournament organizer Neville Turnbull said over 80 local businesses and individuals had made donations of money and/or goods for the auction or to be used as prizes. A total of 26 teams of fours from Palmerston North to Paekakariki played, but mostly local teams filled the field.

John McBeth was Guest Master of Ceremonies and welcomed the players. During the lunch break auctioneer **Arne Jansson** auctioned off a range of goods and services donated by local businesses which were eagerly snapped up by the players.

At the end of play Horowhenua District Mayor **Bernie Wanden** presented the prizes and **Mary Timms**, Arohanui Hospice, Levin Area Representative presented the Arohanui Hospice Trophy to the winning team.
