The End of Bowls at Levin RSA

Sadly the Levin RSA Bowling Club has made the hard decision to close. Despite the efforts of a number of club stalwarts, the relentless ageing of its membership and the difficulty of attracting new and younger members, resulted in the members voting to close at a Special General Meeting.

The club opened after World War II when Mrs Maude Clark gifted the land to the RSA for ex-servicemen to establish a bowling club. It had enjoyed nearly 75 years of operation in a lovely, quiet corner of town on a good quality green. The future of the property is yet to be determined but in the interim a transitional group from the RSA will manage the property and assets.

Levin RSA is the third club in the centre to fold over the last two years following the closure of the Raumati South and Manakau clubs. In addition the Otaki Railway club continues to function without a green, its members sharing facilities with Otaki. It is quite possible that the Central club may be able to continue some use of the green during the winter.

Supporting Our Sponsors

During lockdown one club got to thinking about their sponsors.

"We have 32 of them, all small local businesses who pay for green naming rights and green perimeter signage ... or tournament sponsorship anything from \$250 to \$1,000 a pop. They provide more than 25% of the club's annual income. They're critical to the club.""However, It's pretty easy to imagine that 32 out of 32 of them had a tough lockdown, and may continue to have a tough time even after lockdown ends whenever. We realised that we were now critical to them."But it's one thing to sympathise with their predicament, but quite another to do something about it".
