Programme Changes

After a meeting of the Executive and Match Committee it was decided to change some of the club championship dates to accommodate a number of members, male and female, who wish to play in some events that they have played in over the last few seasons - namely the Taranaki Fours (Men and Women) and the Women's Chartered Clubs Tournament.

The changes are as follows:- Please alter them in your booklet.

- Women's Pairs move from Sun 8 & Sat 28 November to Sat 20 & Sun 21 March.
- Men's Fours move from Sat 23 & Mon 25 January to Sat 13 & Sun 14 February.
- Women's Fours move from Sun 24 & Sat 30 January to Sat 17 & Sun 18 April.

This means that some dates of minor championship events have had to be changed.

- Women's Handicap Singles move from Sat 17 & Sun 18 April to Sun 2 & Sat 8 May to coincide with the dates for the Men's Handicap Singles.
- Mixed Singles move from Sat 20 & Sun 21 March to a later date to be set by the Match Committee.

After two rounds our club's teams are doing pretty well in the various Pennants competitions. At this stage the placing are:

With the small number of entries this season all except men's div II have byes so at this stage positions are influenced by whether teams have had their byes or not.

Our selectors report that our club members, unlike in a number of other clubs, are very keen to be involved in Pennants and Interclub. They are trying to give everyone a game wherever possible.



Statistics from Bowls New Zealand

The latest statistics on bowls membership throughout the country make interesting reading. Over the year from 31 December 2018 to 31 December 2019 the national patterns were as follows:

Full Playing Members increased from 24/154 to 25,182 an increase of 4.26 %

Social Members decreased from 14,849 to 13, 331 a drop of 10.29%

Casual Players increased from 99,587 to 113,326 an increase of 13.81 %.

Note: Bowls N Z counts a casual players each and every time they take part in an event.

The regional patterns are interesting too.

Full Playing members increases were:

Northern Region + 5.45 %

Central Region + 2.90 %

Southern Region + 3.70 %

The fastest growth in Full Playing members was in the Counties-Manakau centre with + 23.15 %, followed by Wairarapa with 22.22 %, Far North with + 14.19 %,

On the other hand the greatest rates of decline in Full Playing membership were in South Otago with -5.79 % decline, followed by North Otago - 4.81 %, **our own Kapiti Coast centre with - 4.15 %.**

In fact Kapiti Coast had the greatest decline in Full playing membership in the Central region. The only other centre to experience decline was Gisborne-East Coast. Some of the Kapiti coast decline can be attributed to the closure of the Raumati South and Manakau over that period, and since then the closure of Levin RSA.

So what are the Kapiti Coast clubs and the centre doing to encourage growth in their Full Playing membership? Over the past decade or so the Kapiti Coast centre's attitude has been to leave player recruitment to the initiative of the individual clubs. Perhaps it is now time for the centre to take a much more proactive stance in promoting our sport in the community with a promotion of the sport and not leave it entirely up to the dwindling number of clubs.

Margaret's Mixed Pairs Gala

With a great deal of early morning work to remove excess water from the cotula green Margaret's 15th mixed Pairs gala went ahead on Wednesday 28 October after being called off two weeks earlier. Two full greens of teams from eight clubs enjoyed a very good day's bowls with both greens playing very well.

On the Dales green Violet Holmes and Brian Thompson were the winners while on the cotula green Jim Bagnall and Julie Stichbury starred. Jim and Julie had a slightly better record and won the overall prize and the trophy.
