Recent Bereavements

It is sad to record the passing of two of our former members - **Ellen Wishart** and **Allan Shanks. Ellen** who died two weeks ago at age 96 was a prominent member (along with husband Jim) in the early part of this century. **Alan** died last week age 87 and was an active bowler up until about five years ago when he moved to Australia. He returned about two years ago and was living at the Masonic village.

For followers of other sports - an unusual connection?

The current All Blacks squad has a close connection to our town. It is well known that hooker **Cody Taylor** is a Levin lad. Cody's family have a long connection to Levin and Cody went to Horowhenua College for three years before being scouted to play for the powerful Feilding High School team, after which me moved to Canterbury and the Crusaders to play professionally.

New All Black **Pasilio Tosi** was also born in Levin and went to Horowhenua College before being picked up by Rotorua Boys High School. His father Nick Tosi was a prominent local cricketer for the Weraroa club. Pasilio first played for Southland before moving on to Bay of Plenty and the All Blacks.

Much less well known is another more tenuous connection to the town. Front row prop **Tyrell Lomax** was born in Australia the son of rugby league legend **John Lomax**. John was one of four brothers who played for Wainuiomata and Wellington. There were times when John and his brothers Arnold, Tony and David were all on the park together for Wellington. John and David both played for the Canberra Raiders and New Zealand. Much later the Lomax family had a connection to Levin when they ran the Levin Sports Bar for a time. So it's a bit harder to claim Tyrell as representing Levin.

Levin has not produced many All Blacks (**Carlos Spencer** being the previous standout, as well as **Terry McCashin**) but I guess it is possible one day soon that maybe there could be three men with a Levin connection in the All Black front row on the same day.
