Byes in the Men's Triples

Well done to the Match Committee for their last ditch efforts to try to avoid a bye in the men's triples champ. By my reckoning there are 50 men who are full playing members of the club. Of those 9 are not currently playing for various reasons, largely related to health. Another 3 were away from Levin at the time so in fact there were only 38 men who could have played in the triples. There were 11 teams entered with 33 players. That's about 88% of all those who could have played. Two others would have played if a third player could have been found to make up a 12th team. So that's a participation rate of around 92 %. You can't really fault that

Speeding Up Play

The Executive is concerned that there are some issues relating to speeding up play on the green. We have instituted time limits for championships up to and including quarter-finals, so in many ways speeding up play is now even more important.

It is concern that a number of our players are not observing the rules related to 'Possession of the Rink" and "Position of Players." These rules are spelled out clearly in the 'Laws of the Sport of Bowls,' Crystal Mark Fourth Edition of 2023. You don't need your own copy. You can read the laws on the Bowls N Z website or download them from the website. Use the Search button as they can be hard to find. Reading online is best as the file is very large.

The appropriate law is:

Section 1.3 Possession of the Rink

12 Position of players

12.1.1 Players at the mat end of the rink who are not delivering a bowl must stand at least 1 m behind the mat.

12.1.2 Players at the head-end of the rink and who are not controlling play must stand:

12.1.2.1 behind the jack if they are members of the team which is in possession of the rink

12.1.2.2 behind the jack and away from the head if they are members of the team not in possession of the rink

12.1.3 on the surrounds if the jack is in the ditch or well clear of the head if it is not possible to stand on the surrounds.

In the case of our club the main issue is players who don't have possession of the head standing around, talking about a shot to play and holding up play and the player who is about to play.

There is also the issue of players who walk down the green crossing into neighbouring rinks and delaying a player who is due to play on that rink.

In Interclub and Centre Open events there are umpires in control of play who may take action. We don't have that luxury in our club championships, so please be aware of these issues and use common sense.

All Blacks from our District

My comments about the composition of the All Black front row last month drew a number of responses – about others from the area who had represented the country that I had left out. That wasn't my aim. I was only doing the front row, but I thought with a bit of time on my hands I could do a bit more research. In fact there are quite a number of players from, or with a connection to Levin, and some more from the wider Horowhenua-Kapiti district.

To start with the locals. The first All Black born in Levin was **Hohepa (Harry) Jacob** who toured NSW with the 1920 team. We can also claim **Cliff Porter** (1923-30) the captain of the 1924 Invincibles who played a few seasons for the now long defunct Hui Mai club from Manakau. There is a photo of that club team with Porter in it when they were club champions in 1923. Then there was along gap to **Terry McCashin** (he went to Horowhenua College) in 1968 and later became a very successful businessman in the brewing industry. Then came **Joe Karam** 1972-75. Joe was born in the King Country went to St Pat's College, Silverstream and played one season for Horowhenua (1971). Joe's family lived locally and all his sisters all went to Horowhenua College, so we'll call Joe a local.

Carlos Spencer (1995-2004) came next. Definitely a local, he went to Waiopehu College and played for Horowhenua before moving to Auckland and the Blues. Codie Taylor (2015 -) the most recent (2024-), and still a top player, and the most recent Pasilio Tosi attended Horowhenua College on their path to national honours. That makes six locally grown All Blacks. In addition there is the case of Dave Pescini. Another product of Horowhenua College. Dave (a long time Otago hooker) was selected for the All Blacks as a reserve for two test matches in the 1970's at a time when reserves never got to take the field.

Further south **Gary Knight** (1977-86), **Mark Shaw** (1980-86), **Christian Cullen** (1996-2003), **Paul Steinmetz** (2002) and **Dane Coles** (2012-2023) all attended either Mana, Kapiti or Paraparaumu colleges. Knight and Shaw play some rep games for Horowhenua. There were also All Blacks with farming connections to the northern Horowhenua – **John Calleson** (1974-76) and **Kevin Eveleigh** lived in our district but played for Manawatu. We can't quite claim the Whitelocks who are from Linton.

There are also a number of former All Blacks who moved into our district after their playing days ended or they retired here. **Beethoven (Beet) Algar** (1920-21) was the first, then **Don McIntosh** an All Black lock (1956-57) who, age 93, still lives in Levin. There is also **Hud Rickit** (1981) who lives in Otaki and has two Selby-Rickit daughters who have played for N Z at netball, and Manaaki Selby-Rickit who currently plays for the Chiefs.

So it is quite a list really. I might do the first-class cricketers next month – that won't take me so long.
