A rainy Tuesday in November meant that Bill's gala had to be cancelled. Bill put a great deal of thought and work into this event and was able to attract great sponsorship from Kia Motors. Bill had originally wanted it to be a three-day event played by club selected fours teams. He was persuaded that two days would be ample for the ageing members of our club. This year the event was moved to November because the autumn programme was bursting at the banks, and it was reduced to one day by popular demand. So, where do we go from here?

Perhaps the best way forward will be for Bill's gala to replace one of our other galas instead of being a extra to be fitted in where we can? It would save having to find another sponsor, and might find a more permanent home in our programme. Food for thought for the programmers.

Other Sports - This Month's Offering. First Class Cricketers from our District

There have been very few cricketers from the Horowhenua district who have represented their country, or even their province. Only four players have represented Central Districts in first-class cricket while living in the Horowhenua.

The first was **Herbert Rice** who began his career in 1937- 38 with Wellington. Then came the Second World War and Herb served overseas. Back in N Z he played one more season captaining the Wellington team before a work transfer brought him to Otaki. He played club cricket for Otaki for many years and represented Horowhenua many times. In 1950-51 Central Districts was formed as a new first-class province and Herb Rice was selected for two games by which time he was in his late 30's and was not called upon again. In all he played only 9 first-class games for the two provinces with a top score of 77. It was Herb who first encouraged me to play cricket for the Otaki club as a primary schoolboy in the 1950's. Often when they played at home Otaki had only 10 men for their team. Herb would give me a shout over the fence and I would race home to get my gear.

Next, **Ray Stewart** arrived from Dunedin where he had studied dentistry and made a few appearances for Otago. With a dental practice in Levin he played for the Weraroa club and represented Horowhenua with distinction as a top order batter. On a few occasions he represented Central Districts though he played only ten first class games in all before he moved to the Bay of Plenty.

The latest is **Mikaela Greig.** Last season Mikaela, from Levin, added to her Central Districts Hinds achievements when she starred for the New Zealand A team which resulted in her being called into White Ferns for the first time. The current Hinds captain, the ex-Waiopehu College student played one T20 international game and was selected for the tour of England in the winter of 2024, though she did not play a game.

English-born **Roger Twose** played for New Zealand in all three formats including 16 tests and 87 ODIs. While living in Levin he played cricket for Levin Old Boys and Central Districts. He married a Levin girl and later moved to Wellington.

There is one other home-grown first-class cricketers from Levin. **Chris Lee** went to Horowhenua College (1985-89) and qualified as a lawyer at Victoria University. He played first-class cricket for both Wellington and Auckland as an opening bowler and capable lower order batter. He played only 9 first-class matches, taking 18 wickets, but his highlight was 111 not out batting at No 10 for Auckland.

Another former New Zealand test player with a Levin connection was **Peter Petherick**. Peter played only 6 test matches as an off spin bowler from Alexandra in Central Otago. He had the distinction of being the first New Zealander to take a test hat-trick in Pakistan in 1976, one of only three world players to have achieved that feat on test debut. Later he had a tyre shop in Waikanae and then retired to Levin. He became a top lawn bowler for the Central club and made a New Zealand pairs final. He died in Perth in 2015.

A test player who retired to Levin was **Don Cleverley**. He played 30 first-class games taking 99 wickets but only two tests. Later he died in Queensland at 94 being the oldest living test cricketer at that time.

An even longer survivor was **Tom Pritchard.** Though he never played for New Zealand he stayed on in England after WW II, qualified for Warwickshire, and in the 1950's was among the top few fast bowlers in English cricket. He retired to Levin, lived here for 30 years before his death, age 100, in 2017.

OK so I had to fill a fourth page but I enjoyed researching this topic and hope some of you read it. What's next? Olympic medals? Hockey?

Constitution Review

A Concerning Trend
