

Interclub

This weekend 14 -15 January are the third days of play for men's and women's Interclub - Men's Premier I & II and Division III on Saturday and Women's Premier I & II on Sunday. The Men's Premier I team are in the best position to qualify for the top 4 finals as they are in second position 2 ½ points ahead of the fifth placed team. Men's Premier II lie 3rd ½ a point ahead of the 4th placed team. Div III have a much tougher task. They will need to win all their final day games to make the play offs.

January Puzzle


Who is this bowler pictured playing his new sport in 1905?

Opinion - A Trying Season for Bowls

This season is proving to be quite a difficult season for playing bowls. Already we have lost a number of days, both at club and centre level. And, the early forecasts for the rest of the summer are not too promising. Higher than normal sea temperatures in the Pacific are a breeding ground for extra-tropical cyclones bringing heavy rain and strong winds to the North Island. Our Match Committee have had to cancel a number of days play in club championships, as well as galas, and it seems the difficult weather is set to continue. For club championships this can lead to a backlog of matches to be played at a later date (if and when there is a day available) or by arrangement among the players concerned.

Maybe there are some ways that we can make the situation a bit easier for all concerned. Some cancellations are made very early, sometimes by 7.30 am. Do we need to cancel so early? I learned during my years as a lawn mowing contractor that often early rain does not mean that it will continue throughout the day. My go-to was the Met Service's rain radar maps which enabled me to track rain patterns and plan my day. Use whatever technology is available to create good decision-making. It is more difficult if both greens are needed and the cotula green is flooded.

Perhaps the playing hours situation could be reviewed a bit later in the morning. It would mean more communication with skips by the Match Committee members tasked with running the day, but it might save some playing days. Even if it was possible to begin by 11 am or midday at least two games could still be played. Players who enter an event commit a day to the event so it is unlikely that that they will be greatly inconvenienced by a later start. We run our Business House Bowls with a start time of 5.45 but we seem reluctant to play daytime bowls beyond about 4.30. In this district often the nicest time of the day is early evening - it is warm and less windy - ideal for bowls.

And, I haven't even mentioned the lights that we have almost totally unused on our carpet green.
